considerations

This month let's consider GROWTH.

A "universal truth is one that never has exceptions. "You must grow to stay alive" is a universal truth.

No exceptions—it is true of all living things. True of bugs, carrots, sunflowers, elephants, ants, weeds, babies, fish, etc. All living things must grow to stay alive! When they stop growing they die.

The same is true for "living" (true) faith. our faith must grow to stay alive! God has given us many references in His Word to the importance of growing and maturing spiritually. John chapter 15 is filled with this emphases.

The first essential to remaining spiritually alive is to remain attached to Christ. If we become detached from Him, we will die spiritually. God supplies us with His Word (in which Jesus is the central subject) for our nourishment. In addition, He gives us Holy Communion (the body and Blood of Jesus) to feed us spiritually. Whenever the Word and Sacrament are used God's Holy Spirit comes to add joy, comfort, and strength (Growth). Our faith grows and prospers as we strengthen our relationship to God.

To ignore spiritual feeding on God's Word is as fatal spiritually as ignoring physical food is fatal to the body.

It's God's design! Physical food for the body. Spiritual food for the soul. Let's not just plan to survive. LET'S THRIVE!!!

God's Word is the most essential part of this goal. Let's read through God's Word in 2022. Start now! By next January 1st you will have concluded the journey. No! It's not to big. Some people claim the Bible can be read in 76 hours. Perhaps, but that's a pretty fast pace with very little meditation.

Actually, 92 hours works better. That breaks down into about 15 minutes a day. That's easily possible for all of us. and if you don't like being timed, read 3-1/4 chapters a day (some long, some short) and you journey will be completed 365 days from NOW.

Caution: Some of the historical books may get boring, when that happens read only one chapter from those books and 2 from Psalms or Proverbs. Keep a list and check them off. I don't want you to become discouraged, as happens to so many who try to read the Bible from cover to cover.

Now that your "in" the Word and growing make sure you worship and commune. Christ promises to be present whenever the church celebrates Communion. You will be strengthened. You will grow!

Associate with believers! God intends for us to be "family". It says so in Ephesians. Through our fellowship we can discuss problems, encourage one another, help each other--and especially pray for each other.

Prayer is such a great gift! God wants to hear from us. And He promises to answer.

Above all--stay firmly attached to the Vine. Re-read John 15.

Read the Word.
Commune regularly.
Fellowship with Christians.
Pray.
THRIVE

.Stamps for missions

Guidelines for Gathering Stamps

- Cut the stamps from envelopes with a 1/4" margin around the stamp. Be careful not to cut the stamp. The perforations must be perfect.
- Do NOT pull or take the stamps from the envelope.
- Commemorative U.S. stamps, denominations larger than first class postage, and foreign stamps are especially valuable.
- Do NOT remove stamps from albums, older postcards and/or envelopes, or first-day covers. Send in the entire album, envelope or postcard. This does not include postal cards sold by the post office. An "old card" is usually from 1930 or before.
- Stamp brokers will not take Christmas stamps; <u>ALSO</u> they no longer accept flag stamps.

Stamps may be placed in the container in the narthex.

(NOTE) When placing a stamp on an envelope, move it down & over a little so it doesn't get torn when opening the envelope.

twelve days of CHRISTMAS

True or not, this sounds plausible. "There is one Christmas Carol that has always baffled me".

What in the world do leaping lords, French hens, swimming swans, and especially the partridge who won't come out of the pear tree have to do with Christmas?

Today, I found out at a women's luncheon at church.

From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of their church. Each element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality which the children could remember.

The partridge in a pear tree was Jesus Christ.

Two turtle doves were the Old and New Testaments.

Three French hens stood for faith, hope and love.

The four calling birds were the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

The five golden rings recalled the Torah or Pentateuch, the first five books of the Old Testament.

The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation.

Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit-Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy.

The eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.

Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit—Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self Control.

The ten lords a-leaping were the ten commandments.

The eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful disciples.

The twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in the Apostles' Creed.

So there is history for today. This knowledge was shared with me and I found it interesting and enlightening and now I know how that strange song became a Christmas carol.


