DIVISIONS

Romans 16:17
I urge you, brothers, to watch out for those who cause divisions and put obstacles in your way that are contrary to the teaching you have learned. Keep away from them.

This month let's consider divisions in the church. We are entering the Lenten season of the church year. This is a time to consider

our sin and look to the Lord with repentance. This is the <u>penitent</u> time of the year when we pause and give special consideration to our sin and what that sin cost our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Read the following illustration and consider how you can put it to work in your life.

Did you ever have something that someone said hit you like a ton of bricks?

That happens to many of us and some can even remember the time and day. For them it is a day they will never forget.

One of these stories is about a 44-year-old woman beginning college. It was during one of her marketing classes that an instructor told the class about "Get To", and it really stuck with her.

The instructor told the class that we walk through life making choices. Some of them are good, and some of them not so good. As a matter of fact some of them are downright sinful, but hopefully we learn something from all of them. The instructor told them a little about attitude and how it affects us all. There was a hand out called "LIFE IS AN ATTITUDE" and they discussed Accountability, Tenacity, Truth, Integrity, Trust, Understanding, Dedication, and Excellence. They learned that we cannot always choose what happens to us, but we can choose our attitudes toward each situation.

If we walk through life on the path we have chosen feeling as though we HAVE to do this or we HAVE to do that, eventually we might feel overwhelmed. They learned about changing attitudes and looking at the opportunities presented to us each day. If we look at those opportunities or challenges with a "GET TO" instead of a "HAVE TO" we enjoy the journey just a little bit more.

Our student decided to make a conscious effort over the next couple of days to exchange the words "have to" with "get to" in her conversations with friends, co-workers, and family, but most of all in her

thoughts, and something amazing happened. She noticed all the things she "GOT TO" do and started appreciating the opportunities and challenges on her nath

Think about it, she says:

I get to go to school to fulfill my dream.

I get to go to work when so many people can't.

I get to do the laundry, thankful for a washer and dryer.

I get to play with my cat who is so thankful for the attention.

I get to say a prayer, I have freedom of speech.

I get to remember the things that make me happy.

I get to spend time with a friend, who needs my help.

I get to read a book, I still have my sight.

I get to go to church, because My Savior, Jesus Christ, died for me!!!

I give you a challenge. With every thought and conversation for the next day or two, change the words "I HAVE TO" with the words "I GET TO" and see if it makes a difference in your day.

Our Lord and our church offer us many opportunities to serve in harmony and fellowship with the other believers in our congregation. Are we doing that or are we standing off in the distance and causing divisions in the "Body of Christ," the church.

Jesus tells us in John 8:47, He who belongs to God hears what God says. The reason you do not hear is that you do not belong to God." Each of us must look into our own hearts and truthfully answer these questions. Am I refusing to hear God's Word? Am I guilty of causing division within the church by speaking out against the church? What can I do to bring healing and harmony to the congregation?

Our wonderful Lord suffered and died on the cross to forgive all our sins including those of turning our back on Him and on the During this Lenten season we church. should all look to Him for forgiveness and ask for help to resolve any problems we may have with the church or any of its members. Jesus suffered great pain on that cross on Calvary and he suffers every time we sin. but he and all the angels rejoice when just one sinner returns through faith and repentance. We "GET TO" thank God through our worship, service and giving. We "GET TO" worship Christ every Sunday and at our Midweek Lenten services. We "GET TO" receive His Body and Blood at His Table. What a wonderful God we have. To God alone be the glory.





STAMPS FOR MISSIONS

Guidelines for Gathering Stamps



- 2. Do NOT pull or take the stamps from the envelope.
- 3. Commemorative U.S. stamps, denominations larger than first class postage, and foreign stamps are especially valuable.
- 4. Do NOT remove stamps from albums, older postcards and/or envelopes, or first-day covers. Send in the entire album, envelope or postcard. This does not include postal cards sold by the post office. An "old card" is usually from 1930 or before.
- 5. Stamp brokers will not take Christmas stamps; <u>ALSO</u> they no longer accept flag stamps.

Stamps may be placed in the container in the narthex.

(NOTE) When placing a stamp on an envelope, move it down & over a little so it doesn't get torn when opening the envelope.





Epiphany and its Season

Begins with evening prayer on January 5; and Ends the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday. Epiphany is one of the oldest seasons in the Christian Church Year, second only to the Easter season. This season of lights emphasizes Jesus' manifestation, (or epiphany, from the Greek epiphaneia) as God and man. The earliest Christians called the Feast of the Epiphany the Theophany ("revelation of God"). When the Gentile Magi come to worship Jesus, they show that now everyone has access to God. Now all people, Jew and Gentile, can come to God's temple to worship, because Jesus is the new temple: God in the flesh. The Epiphany of Our Lord (January 6) marks the celebration of the visit of the Magi.

Epiphany may include as many as nine Sundays, depending on the date of Easter. The season is marked at its beginning and at its end by two important feasts of Christ.

On the First Sunday after the Epiphany, the Church celebrates the Baptism of Our Lord. The Father had sent Jesus to bear the sins of the world. So Jesus steps down into baptismal waters so that He can soak up the sins of the world: He is baptized into our sins, so that our Baptism might be into His death and resurrection for the forgiveness of sins.

The Feast of the Transfiguration, celebrated on the last Sunday in the Epiphany season, is a significant and uniquely Lutheran contribution to the Christian calendar. The festival commemorates the moment on the Mount of Transfiguration when three of Jesus' disciples glimpsed their Lord in divine splendor, seeing Him as the center of the Law (Moses) and the Prophets (Elijah). Jesus proclaims to His disciples, then and now, that He is the long-awaited one who has come to die for the sins of the world and be raised again in glory.
