This month let's "consider" cobwebs. COBWEBS? Yes, cobwebs. CONSIDER this story:

A committee from a church met with an artist to commission him to paint a picture of a dying church, a request hat he found very intriguing. Weeks later he met with the committee again and unveiled his painting.

They were surprised. He had painted a picture of a magnificent church, beautifully landscaped, with the doors wide open. Through the doors he had pictured a large congregation at worship, huge columns supporting a beautifully appointed interior. To the right of the doors he had painted an announcement board, full to overflowing with activities.

Finally, a spokesperson for the committee suggested that a mistake had been made. They had asked for a picture of a dying church, not one that was so obviously alive. "There has been no mistake," said the artist, calling their attention to a small detail in his picture. To the left of the open doors, lost in some shadows, he had painted a small box identified with the word *Missions*. And over the slot in the top of the box he had painted a cobweb. "There," he said, "is your dying church."

Cobwebs happen, not only to mission boxes but human-care boxes, forgive-one-another boxes, all such boxes. When this happens, it requires more than a mere dusting with some sort of pledge to do better. It requires a long careful look into the manger (and beyond to the empty cross and tomb), a look like that of mother Mary, who "kept all these things and pondered them in her heart." It is that kind of look that dusts off the boxes and returns them to front and center in our lives.

So, where are we, you and me? Are we more interested in what goes on inside the church or might we think about focusing efforts outside of the church to the

surrounding community and beyond? It seems now that most of our efforts are focused inside the church.

So, what can we do? It has been shown many times that if a church wants to grow, its focus must be first on Christ and second on people outside of the church. The shift needs to be from ourselves to Christ and His kingdom as being the most important focus of our lives and actions. Until this happens little will change in this and every other struggling church.

After these things have been done, then people will begin to introduce others to our wonderful, merciful Savior. Then churches grow and the cobwebs over the mission box disappear. God blesses those who are following Christ, believing and trusting in Him and not focusing on themselves.

As we begin a new year, let's work on changing our focus, that of the church and that of ourselves. Trust in Christ and work at building His kingdom and not our own. The Christ in the manger is also the Christ on the cross and has given us much including forgiveness, life and salvation. In gratitude let's give Him our focus, our will, and our hearts as we work to spread his kingdom in our homes, community, and country..

.Stamps for missions

Guidelines for Gathering Stamps

- Cut the stamps from envelopes with a 1/4" margin around the stamp. Be careful not to cut the stamp. The perforations must be perfect.
- Do NOT pull or take the stamps from the envelope.
- Commemorative U.S. stamps, denominations larger than first class postage, and foreign stamps are especially valuable.
- 4. Do NOT remove stamps from albums, older postcards and/or envelopes, or first-day covers. Send in the entire album, envelope or postcard. This does not include postal cards sold by the post office. An "old card" is usually from 1930 or before.
- Stamp brokers will not take Christmas stamps; <u>ALSO</u> they no longer accept flag stamps.

Stamps may be placed in the container in the narthex.

(NOTE) When placing a stamp on an envelope, move it down & over a little so it doesn't get torn when opening the envelope.





PERSPECTIVE

For a small amount of perspective at this moment, imagine you were born in 1900. When you are 14, World War I starts, and ends on your 18th birthday with 22 million people killed. Later in the year, a Spanish Flu epidemic hits the planet and runs until you are 20. Fifty million people die from it in those two years. Yes, 50 million.

When you're 29, the Great Depression begins. Unemployment hits 25%, global GDP drops 27%. That runs until you are 33. The country nearly collapses along with the world economy. When you turn 39, World War II starts. You aren't even over the hill yet.

When you're 41, the United States is fully pulled into WWII. Between your 39th and 45th birthday, 75 million people perish in the war and the Holocaust kills six million. At 52, the Korean War starts and five million perish.

At 64 the Vietnam War begins, and it doesn't end for many years. Four million people die in the conflict. Approaching your 62nd birthday you have the Cuban Missile Crisis, a tipping point in the Cold War. Life on our planet, as we know it, could well have ended. Great leaders prevented that from happening.

As you turn 75, the Vietnam War finally ends. Think of everyone on the planet born in 1900. How do you survive all of that? A kid in 1985 didn't think their 85 your old grandparent understood how hard school was. Yet those grandparents (and now great grandparents) survived through everything listed above.

Perspective is an amazing art. Let's try and keep things in perspective. Let's be smart, help each other out, and we will get through all of this. In the history of the world, there has never been a storm that lasted. This too, shall pass. God is with us, pray, pray and more prayer.
